In Addition to the Grant Recipients, the PBOCC Women's Club will soon be announcing the recipient of a \$2000 college scholarship, who is a 2024 graduating High School senior and parishioner of Precious Blood of Christ Catholic Church. Also, a \$1000 tuition scholarship will be awarded to a parishioner who is attending Seton High School.

J.O.Y. School – J.O.Y. is Jesus first, Others second, Yourself last.

The J.O.Y. School is a non-profit, nondenominational program at Pawleys Island Presbyterian for children with disabilities. During the summer, the school operates for 6-7 weeks/5 hours a day. Children come from local counties and others come from far away with their vacationing families. No child is turned away, no matter the severity of his/her mental or physical disabilities. This year they are celebrating their 40th anniversary.

Martha Insignares, a member of PBOC parish and our Women's Club, is the program director. She is assisted by nurses in training, professional therapists, local youth volunteers, visiting church youth groups and professionally trained men and women who return every year to ensure the school's success.

Each year, the school asks local church and community groups to provide lunch for 30 students and staff each week. The Women's Club has assisted with this program for a number of years. This year we are scheduled to provide the lunches the week of June 17 - 20. Lunches are only required for four days that week.

This year, a specific menu has been created for each day to simplify the meal preparation for the Women's Club volunteers. The four meals will be: meat loaf, sandwiches, hamburger casserole and hot dog casserole. Side dishes, fruit and dessert are also provided each day. The lunch must be delivered to the Presbyterian Church by 11:15 am each day.
