#### Plant Sales

The fall sale was so popular, that we decided to offer amaryllis instead of poinsettias for Christmas.

Again the participation was outstanding. So many had never enjoyed an amaryllis and were amazed at their beauty for Christmas and found that they could plant them in their garden after blooming.

If fall and winter flower sales were so popular, could we go wrong in offering a spring flower sale? We were able to get, from our growers, beautiful red geraniums. One member told me that these were "geraniums on steroids".

This past September, we again offered beautiful mums and our Christmas plant is, again, the amaryllis. We also offered a beautiful pot, complete with stand, of succulents. Don't forget to pick up your preorders on December 10<sup>th</sup>!

## Paula Deen's Turkey & Stuffing Casserole

#### Ingredients:

4 to 5 cups diced leftover turkey
One 10.75 ounce can condensed cream of mushroom soup

One 8-ounce carton sour cream

3 cups herb-flavored stuffing mix (I like Pepperidge Farm)

½ (1stick) butter, melted

1 cup chicken broth (canned is fine)

#### Directions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 F. Spray a 13 by 9 inch glass casserole dish with vegetable oil cooking spray
- 2. In a medium bowl, stir together the turkey, soup and sour cream
- 3. Place the mixture in the prepared dish and pat down evenly with the back of a spoon
- 4. In a clean medium bowl, stir together the stuffing mix, butter, and broth. Spread evenly over the turkey mixture
- 5. Bake for 30 to 40 minutes, until the stuffing topping is browning and the casserole is hot and bubbly
